She has twice won the Pennsylvania Partner's in the Arts Project Stream grant award - in 2007 for her premiere of *An Evening of James Whitcomb Riley* and in 2005 for her premiere of *The Heartsongs of Opal Whiteley*. She was also the recipient of the WFMA 2002 Kate Wolf Memorial Award, and The 1997 Kerrville Music Foundation's Outstanding Female Vocalist of the Year Award. The list goes on... but she has also managed to dedicate herself to issues of social justice as a practicing and award-winning social worker.
